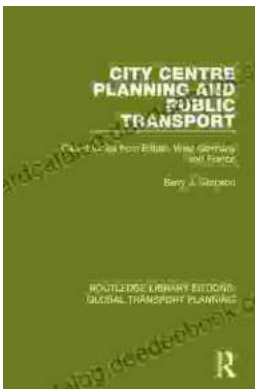
steps outlined in this report, we can help to reduce the risk of conflict in space, and ensure that the benefits of the Second Space Age are shared by all.

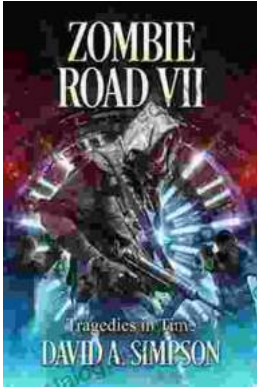
