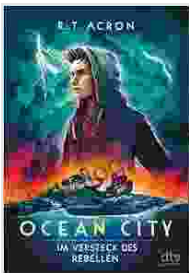

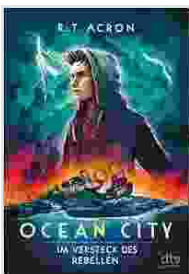
By train, you can take Amtrak to the Ocean City station. From there, you can take a taxi or bus to the town center.

By bus, you can take Greyhound to the Ocean City bus station. From there, you can take a taxi or bus to the town center.

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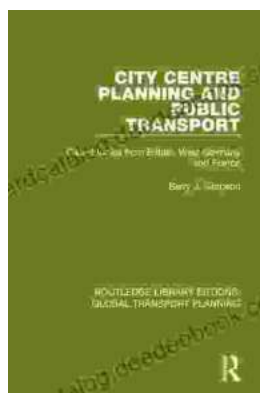
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
